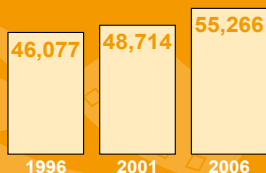

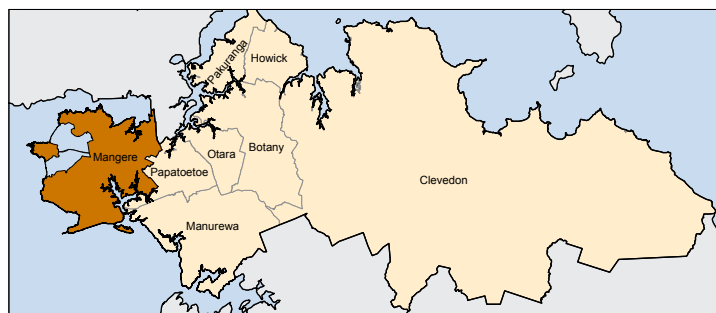

Mangere is the original home of the Maori tribes Waio-hua and Tainui. The rich volcanic soil provided perfect conditions for Maori to develop the area as a food basket for greater Auckland, and as a provider of food to early European settlements from the 1840s onwards. Until the mid 1940s Mangere was largely a market garden and farming area. This history has recently been recognised and celebrated through the preservation of the Otutata Stonefields. Following the Second World War the settlement grew into a thriving suburb of Auckland. The development of the Auckland International Airport, concentrated effort to improve the quality of water in the harbour, and a focus on large housing projects has rapidly increased Mangere's population. Mangere is the gateway to and from New Zealand and is home to many significant heritage sites. Today, people in Mangere particularly like living in an area with strong historical and family associations. They enjoy living with the diverse range of people from different cultures who have made Mangere their home. Housing is affordable, while good parks and transport, and a pristine coastal location contribute to the health, wellbeing and social cohesion of the community.



Maori and 11% Asian. Mangere has a very youthful population, with 39% under 20 years while the median age of residents is 26 years. Although 6% of residents hold an advanced vocational qualification, 30% do not hold any formal qualification. The majority of adults, 40%, are employed as either plant and machinery workers or in elementary occupations while 37% of residents are employed as either professionals, managers or clerks. City-wide comparisons show Mangere to have the most number of workers in the Transport, Postal and Warehousing industry.

Statistical Highlights

Mangere is Manukau City's second most populous community, with 55,266 residents of which 62% of residents belong to the Pacific Peoples ethnic group, followed by 20% European, 18%
